It also has a more greyish surface, where as the actual floor is of a more yellowish brown nature. Munsell reading defines colour of the soil as pale brown (10YR 6/3). The soil is a silty clay matrix ^{context} and features some charcoal inclusions. In the mid-eastern part of the floor, along the bench, the soil seems looser and of a darker colour and also contains more charcoal and could be an animal burrow animal burrow, + confirmed! The floor is uneven and has been dug through in some areas. it has not been traced in the middle part of the floor ^{space} measurements: 1-4cm thickness Eastern area = 52 x 146 cm Western area: 88 x 92 cm
